During the past year, Project Discovery of Virginia, Inc. continued its commitment to providing essential resources and tools required for students to successfully transition to post-secondary education. Our agency's education access program is offered through 22 community-based programs throughout Virginia with a focus on grades 4 to 12.

Project Discovery has successfully enhanced its governance component as well as the organization's leadership and administrative staff, all designed to more effectively address the agency's programmatic initiatives. In concert with our 22 community-based programs, vital assistance was provided to more than 1500 students enabling them to matriculate to the next grade level or graduate successfully during the past year. Through a clearer and more focused vision, our agency has enhanced its capacity to enable every participating student to

graduate from high school and to attend post-secondary education.


During FY 2020, Project Discovery managed total resources of approximately \$1.2 million, which included \$189,101 in Federal Community Services Block Grant. With these assets, our agency has undertaken an appropriate rebranding initiative, designed to unify essential state-wide partnerships successfully. 

These funds are deposited into a Virginia 529 account and are ready for use when the student enrolls in college.

For nearly four decades, Project Discovery has worked with thousands of students in the Commonwealth of Virginia. Project Discovery assists students from predominantly low to moderate-income households or students who would be the first in the family to attend college.

The Project Discovery Program works through 19 partner agencies in 22 locations to provide activities in 145 schools. Project Discovery combines a nationally recognized curriculum of workshops designed to improve study skills, time management, and financial planning with assistance to students and parents applying for both admission and financial aid.

Project Discovery also takes students to college campuses where they can meet with financial aid and admissions officers, talk with students and professors, and see for themselves that college is attainable and important.
